About the course

The level 6 supervision diploma course is for arts therapists qualified to MA or equivalent level and for suitably qualified professionals who use art within their supervisory practice or supervise art therapists or arts in health practitioners as part of their work.

The diploma is accredited by CPCAB (Counselling and Psychotherapy Central Awarding Body). Suitably experienced overseas applicants wishing to specialise in this area are also welcome to apply.

The diploma is a theory-informed and practice-based course aimed to equip students with the knowledge and skills required to provide effective, inspiring, ethical, and art-based supervision to those they supervise from arts therapies and related professions (arts in health, counselling, psychotherapy, etc.)

About the role

We are looking for a qualified and highly experienced art therapist with significant experience in providing supervision to lead the supervision diploma. The lead will be adept at online virtual course delivery and familiar with managing tutors and overseeing students. We are looking for someone with excellent organisational and communications skills to lead on this popular and valued course.

The course leader will be responsible for overseeing the course, its assets, and standards. They are responsible for the course delivery, team roles (the recruitment and management of the teaching team), and recruitment of students (following course requirements). The course leader will oversee the delivery of the supervision diploma and assure educational standards in line



with CPCAB approval.
